BCD INPUT TO BINARY CONVERSION submitted by STAFF

....I wanted to input my digital clock (HH:MM) to the computer via the parallel input port, but the data was in BCD format. This routine converts it into the decimal representation that BASIC can understand. The concept works for 8 bits too.

100 REM DATA INPUT TO D5, D6 IS A TEMP VARIABLE
110 LET D4 = INT(D5/4096)
120 LET D6 = D5-D4*4096
130 LET D3 = INT(D6/256)

23:59 hours in binary coded dec. 0010 0011 0101 1001 is read into BASIC as 9049. This routine uses division by powers of 16 (4 binary bits) to do the conversion. Similar routines can be used to convert other bases. (D0 is the output.)

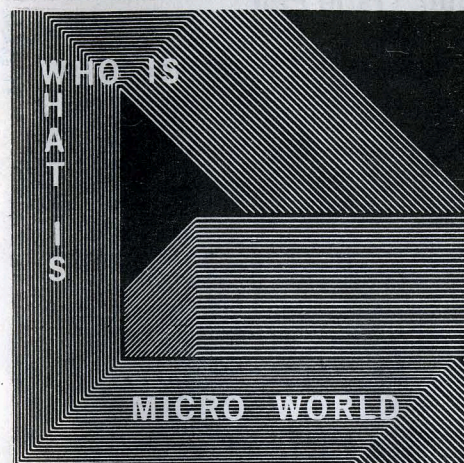

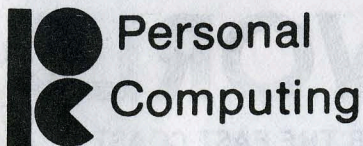
## MOS 6502 BASED SYSTEMS

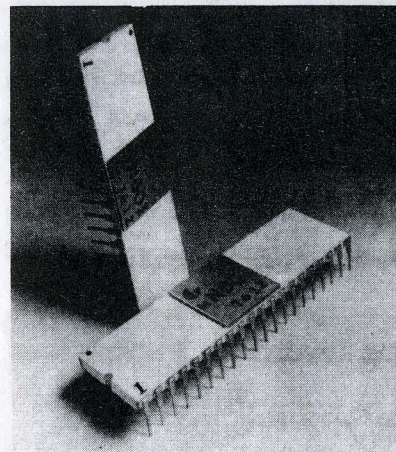

## 16 BITS WITH HARDWARE MULTIPLY AND DIVIDE. SOFTWARE SUPPORT

DATA GENERAL has released its 16  
bit NOVA minicomputer on a single  
chip. It features complete architecture  
and NOVA software support. Called the  
mN601, it is a full 16 bit system with  
32k memory address capacity and in-  
cludes hardware MULTIPLY/DIVIDE  
(16 bit), a stack and real-time clock.  
The chip operates at 960nsec and con-  
tains refresh logic for dynamic memory.  
They also have seven support chips in-  
cluding the mN606 a 4k RAM, mN603  
intelligent I/O controller, and system  
buffer IC's which can be used to expand

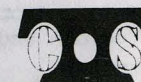
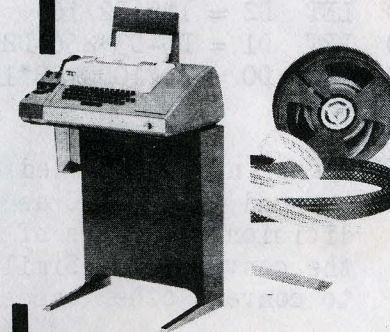
